#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It was wonderful to see the K-2 students dressed in their creative hats during our Easter Hat Parade last week – they looked amazing and the students were excited to display their hats. #### **School Photos**

On Thursday 4 April (tomorrow) the students will be having individual, class and sibling photos taken. It is important that all children attend, unless unwell. The students are to wear their full summer uniform, including black shoes. Children are not to wear their sports uniform. Group photos for groups such as PSSA teams, dance groups, etc will be taken later in the year.

# **Anzac Day Ceremony**

The school will be acknowledging Anzac Day on Friday 12 April. The ceremony will commence at 10:15am and will be held under the COLA (basketball court). All students attend and parents are welcome to join us. Students and parents have the opportunity to lay a flower if desired. If wet, it will be held in the school hall.

# **Years 3-6 Cross Country Carnival**

The school will be holding its Years 3-6 Cross Country Carnival on Thursday 2 May. It will be held on the school grounds (as well as using some of the high school oval) and the age groups will only join when their event is happening. Parents are welcome to attend. It is anticipated, but could change, that the 12 year olds will start at 9:10am and will be followed by the 11 year old students. From 11:20am the 10 year old students will commence their races and will be followed by the 8 and 9 year olds (who compete against each other). Students in Year 2, who turn 8 this year and are strong runners, have the opportunity to compete in the 8/9 year race – please note they will be competing against students who are also turning 8 or 9 this year.

# **Mother's Day Stall**

The P&C will be holding the Mother's Day stall again this year. It will be held on Wednesday 8 May. More details will be provided at a later date.

# Safe Use of Technology

These days adults and children have greater access to technology than ever before. Whilst this can bring tremendous benefits, it can also lead to danger, create anxiety and expose children to unsuitable content.

Please be mindful of any online access your children may have and determine how you will monitor this. This might be games, social media platforms, search engines, etc. It is important to regularly discuss with your children the importance of protecting their identity and not engaging in activities that are not age appropriate.

It is also important that your child is not using a password that is easily guessed as this can lead to someone accessing their details.

Parents are also reminded that they should not be posting photos and/or videos that include children other than their own on social media unless permission has been granted.

## Opportunity Class (OC) Applications Open

OC Year 5 entry in 2025: Applications are open 4 April-20 May 2024

What are opportunity classes?

Opportunity classes are one of the ways the NSW Department of Education supports high potential and gifted students. The classes help students learn by:

- grouping them with other gifted students
- using specialised teaching methods so students can learn concepts in more detail and more quickly
- supporting their wellbeing needs.

Most students in opportunity classes enjoy learning with peers who have similar abilities and interests. Opportunity classes are **not** zoned.

#### Where are they located?

There are 86 primary schools with opportunity classes in NSW each year, of which 54 schools are located in metropolitan Sydney.

Students successfully placed attend the opportunity class full time in Years 5 and 6 at the relevant public school. In most cases, students who have accepted a place in an opportunity class will leave their current school to attend the school with the opportunity class.

#### Should you apply?

If your child learns with greater ease and speed than their classmates, they may benefit from placement in an opportunity class. High potential and gifted children need to be challenged so they remain engaged with their education. Discuss the opportunity with your child and look through the information together on Opportunity classes – Year 5. If you would like to discuss whether you think you should apply, please contact your child's teacher.

#### Equity provisions

The <u>Equity Placement Model</u> helps to make access to opportunity classes fairer for the following underrepresented groups:

- students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- students from rural and remote locations
- students with disability.

The Equity Placement Model holds up to 20% of places at each school for students from these groups to support an increase in their participation.

Students from these groups may be considered for equity placement if their test performance is within 10% of general applicants for each school. Learn more about the placement process and the placement test at Opportunity classes (Year 5-6).

# SCHOOL PHOTO DAY REMINDER: Thursday 4 April

- Each student must return their personalised completed envelope on the photo day.
- If you did not receive a personalised envelope your child should have been given a blank envelope instead.
- <u>Sibling photos</u>: You may order online or a separate <u>siblings</u> envelope will need to be completed and are available at the school office.
